In May 2019, Chancellor Angela Merkel said: "The old certainties of the post-war order no longer apply." While this statement was to some degree a comment on the Trump presidency, it also alludes to the major changes in German-American relations from World War II till today. What began as occupation and reeducation turned into an important partnership, that like all long-term relationships went through good times and the bad, with the weaker partner growing more emancipated overtime. The seminar will have both a strong focus on history and on more recent developments, which we will also discuss with guests.
